At NSUN, we believe that people should be paid for their time if they are participating in research with us, creating content as a member, or taking part in an NSUN event as a speaker or panellist. We also acknowledge that these payments are a token of our appreciation but do not fully cover the experience, expertise, and wisdom that your work or perspectives bring.

Below are the rates of payment for different types of activities.

Tax/benefits information for recipients

We know that receiving ad-hoc payments or “gifts” like these can impact on your tax and/or benefits. You may already be familiar with this process, and know how to navigate involvement payments, or it may be a new – and daunting – prospect. You are responsible for letting the DWP and/or HMRC know about payments you receive for work, if necessary.
